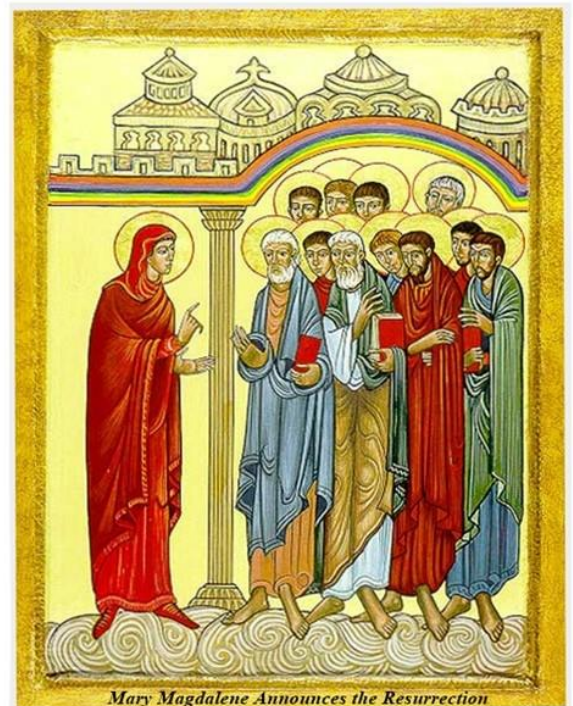
EWTN features UCE in interview April 9

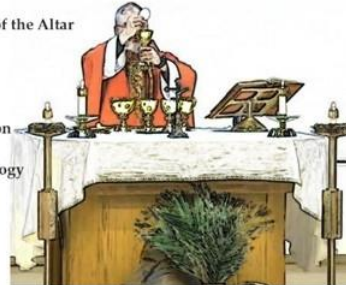


