## THE RESURRECTION OF THE LORD



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

*“He is not here, he is risen.”* (Lk. 24:6)

With these simple words, the Church proclaims the heart of our faith: Jesus Christ, who suffered and died for us, has truly risen from the dead. Easter is not simply the remembrance of a past event. Easter is the living victory of the Lord who enters the present—our fears, our wounds, our sins, and even our death—and transforms them from within by the power of His divine life.

In the Resurrection, the Father reveals that love is stronger than sin, mercy is stronger than guilt, and life is stronger than the grave. As St. Paul teaches: *“If Christ has not been raised, then empty is our preaching; empty too, your faith”* (1 Cor. 15:14). But Christ is risen—and therefore hope is not a dream. Christian hope has a name and a face: Jesus, the Crucified and Risen One.

Through Baptism, we are not passive spectators of Easter; we are made participants in it. *“We were indeed buried with Him through baptism into death; so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead...we too might live in newness of life”* (Rom 6:4). Jesus, the risen Lord, calls each of us to begin; to renounce what leads to death, to forgive as we have been forgiven, to return to prayer, to the Sacraments, and to the works of charity that make His light visible in the world.

May this Easter season renew our parish with deeper faith, a steadier hope, and a more generous love. Let us welcome the Risen Christ in the Holy Eucharist, where He truly and substantially remains with us, and let us carry His peace into our homes, our workplaces, and our community. Wishing you and your loved ones a blessed and joyful Easter season.

Christ is risen! Truly He is risen! Alleluia!

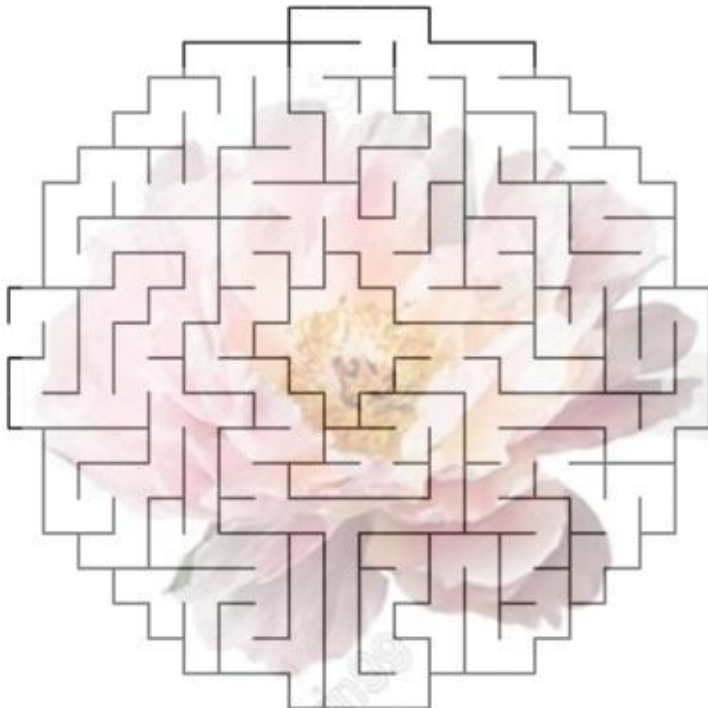



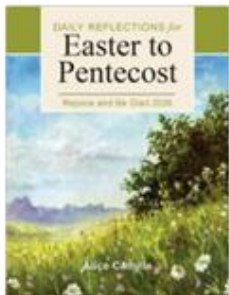
