The Eucharist is the sacrament of love; it signifies love; it produces love. –St. Thomas Aquinas

Thursday, March 7th marked the 750th anniversary of one of my favorite saints and doctors of the Church: St. Thomas Aquinas. Thomas studied at the Abbey of Monte Casino and The University of Naples. He later went on to teach at the University of Paris as a Master of Theology. Thomas is considered one of the greatest philosophers and theologians of all time writing works such as the famous multi volume, *Summa Theologica* which is still studied in many colleges, universities, and seminaries today.



Also known as the “angelic doctor,” Thomas was not just a giftedly brilliant thinker and teacher, he is also known for his deep holiness and unwavering love and devotion to the Most Holy Eucharist. His theological mind and poetic gift of prayer can be appreciated through chants such as, *Tantum Ergo, O Salutaris,* and *Adoro te Devote* all of which praise and worship Jesus in the miracle of the Holy Eucharist.

Recalled by his biographers, in the last days of his life Thomas asked to be helped to his Holy Hour. As he approached the Blessed Sacrament he offered this prayer, “I receive you, price of the redemption of my soul, I receive you, viaticum of my pilgrimage. For your love I have studied, I have kept vigil and I have spent myself; I have preached you, I have taught you and I have never expressed anything that is against you, and if it has happened I have done it unintentionally and I do not persist in that opinion. And if I have said anything wrong about this Sacrament or anything else, I submit myself entirely to the correction of the Holy Church of Rome, in whose obedience I now leave this life.” On March 7, 1274, at the age of 49 Thomas Aquinas was taken home to the Lord. His feast day is January 28th.

In these days of Lent may we grow closer to the Eucharistic Heart of Jesus.

St. Thomas Aquinas, pray for us.
