







**1st Luminous Mystery- The Baptism of the Lord**

"It happened in those days that Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized in the Jordan by John. On coming out of the water he saw the heavens being torn open and the Spirit, like a dove, descending upon him. And a voice came from the heavens, 'You are my beloved Son, with you I am well pleased.'" Mark 1:9-11

The Shroud of Turin is a blood stained linen cloth that bears the image of a crucified man believed by many to be Jesus of Nazareth. It is one of the most scientifically studied archeological artifacts in the world, yet modern science cannot explain how the mysterious image on the Shroud was formed.

Dalton has spoken at the National Eucharistic Congress, SEEK, and World Youth Day. He was also featured on Pints with Aquinas in 2023 with Matt Fradd.
