Rite of Election took place at the Cathedral of the Sacred Heart on Sunday February 22nd. Please keep the Elect in your prayers as they continue to prepare to receive the Sacraments at the Easter Vigil.

"The Rite of Election includes the enrollment of names of all the Catechumens seeking baptism at the coming Easter Vigil. Typically, on the first Sunday of Lent, the Catechumens, their sponsors and families gather at the cathedral church. The Catechumens publicly express their desire for baptism to the diocesan bishop. Their names are recorded in a book and they are called the Elect."

The days of Lent are the final Period of Purification and Enlightenment leading up to the Easter Vigil. Lent is a period of preparation marked by prayer, study, and spiritual direction for the Elect, and prayers for them by the parish communities." USCCB

3rd Sorrowful Mystery- The Crowning of Thorns

On a mental pain note, How do we respond when someone calls us names or tells lies about us? Or maybe calls one of our family members' names or lies about them? Do we lash out and call them names or say bad things, lies about them? Someone who does this may be hurting in a way we don't know about or understand. Maybe they are a bully trying to get their way. How we respond says more about us than what they were trying to say. Can we speak in loving ways to defend ourselves against the accusation or do we go ballistic too?
