Second Luminous Mystery
The Wedding Feast at Cana

Jesus' first miracle, the one that initiates his public ministry, begins with a request from his mother, Mary. Mary sees a family's need and brings this concern to her son by saying, "They have no wine." She asks him to intervene, having great confidence and trust that her son will do what she asks. Jesus responds to his mother, "Woman, what does this have to do with me? My hour has not yet come."

Initially, this response from Jesus sounds a bit rude, but He is not being disrespectful to his mother. He is asking her what this has to do with both of them out of concern for her. Mary and Jesus know the significance of this request...this miracle. They know that it signifies the beginning of a deep sorrow that will lead to the fulfillment of God's great promise of mercy and salvation and the hope and glory of the resurrection. Jesus is asking his mother if she is sure that this is what she wants because they both know that this request will launch her son into his public ministry. She is aware of the sword that will pierce her heart and his, but she lets go of her son and continues her fiat—to do God's will.

The last words we hear from Mary are, "Do whatever He tells you." These words encourage us to trust Jesus with our whole heart. Jesus and Mary see our needs and respond with love and care. When we pray the rosary, we are asking the Blessed Mother to intervene for us just like she did at the Wedding at Cana. Mary and Jesus see us, they know our names and our needs, and they respond. We are not alone.

It is one of the most scientifically studied archeological artifacts in the world, yet modern science cannot explain how the mysterious image on the Shroud was formed.
